News from Haiti by Arnold Lezcano

Felix, our Sponsorship Coordinator in Haiti, explains that after the August 14th earthquake, the country's situation is "very heavy and bad." He tells us his heart is heavy for the "issues of insecurity, the loss of many lives, the current mode of governance, and the absence of basic needs."

The insecurity problem in Haiti has been the most troubling as armed groups are

multiplying everywhere, control many sectors, and some even work for Haitian leaders. **"The gangs know that they are big and strong,"** says Felix, and **"they are conquering more territory, taking taxes from the hands of people, especially business owners, companies, at the ports, on the roads, and they made me suffer too."**

Over a month ago, on his way to visit children after the earthquake, **Felix was robbed at gunpoint by three gang members!** They stole his motorcycle, phones and the wifi router he uses for internet. He had no choice but to surrender because "they get very aggressive and jealous, they kidnap, they steal, they do sexual violence and even kill for money!" After this awful event, we lost communication with Felix for several weeks.

After those weeks of worried confusion, we were very grateful that Felix was able to communicate with us and let us know that he was still safe. We recently purchased him another phone and wifi router so that he can send us updated pictures and letters from our Haitian children. We are also in communication with a few religious sisters to see if they can help Felix gather these items while he does not have steady transportation. In addition, we are also trying to help Felix to purchase another motorcycle.

Felix assures us that "as for my commitment, I would like to tell the sponsors that I always want to work with CARITAS because I love working with children, but there are these problems here that disturb me." He asks us to please pray for Haiti. Very soon, he will be sending our sponsors updated letters and pictures of the children who are currently going to school.

Before he was robbed, Felix was luckily able to visit several schools: "Thank God many children are there, however some of them were forced to leave the area where they live fearing for their safety." We now know that many schools are functioning as normal. Unfortunately, in more dangerous areas such as Martissant, La saline, Village de Dieu, Belle-Air, and a part of Croix-des-Bouquets, the school doors are closed. Felix tells us that "no one can frequent these places apart from the armed bandits."

This is a very difficult time for Felix, our sponsored children, and for all the of We inhabitants Haiti. greatly appreciate your concern and support for them and will keep you informed about new developments.

Her enrollment in our CARITAS program began her relationships with her loving sponsors who have walked with her through the years. Jackie values their love and commitment, saying "My sponsors are really my heroes and heroines! I have always had a good parent-child, communicative relationship with my sponsors and have been able to talk to them, even during difficult periods in my life. I immensely value their words of comfort and encouragement as they helped me appreciate the depth of love and help heal my spirit. Communication with my sponsors has given me encouragement to push harder, and study harder to perform well in school. They have always told me that they believed in me and that I would succeed in life."

Jackie has big plans for her nursing career and is highly motivated to care for the sick and suffering. After she becomes a registered nurse (God willing, in two more years), **she plans to open her own medical clinic and hopes that it will one day grow to a medical center or hospital!** She is excited to help others and to be able to support herself. "Were it not for CARITAS, I would not be this far along in my goals and dreams – I am now living to serve the suffering Christ in our nursing patients, and I am part of the healing ministry of Our Lord Jesus Christ."



These two girls are in desperate need of sponsors to give them a chance at a better life!

Josephine's mother has been suffering from a mental disorder for over 10 years which sometimes causes her to run away and live on the streets. Her condition makes her husband very sad, and though he tries very hard he cannot make enough money to sustain the family as well as pay for the medical bills and treatment of his wife.
