A HOME FOR VERONICA AND HER CHILDREN

Ways to Give for Advent and Christmas

This year, we are highlighting **three meaningful ways to give**, each one bringing real transformation and dignity to our communities.

1. CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKETS & TOYS FOR KIDS

This Christmas, CARITAS hopes to provide 200 Family Food & Toy Baskets for some of the most vulnerable families in our programs. Each \$100 basket includes a full week of nutritious food for the family and toys for the children, gifts many of them have never received before.

During Easter, our food basket drive brought incredible joy as families gathered at our CARITAS Center, and our team traveled to remote areas to reach those who could not travel. We hope to bless families again with a Christmas celebration filled with joy, dignity, and hope.

2. EDUCATION & SUSTAINABILITY PROJECT (PHASE 1)

In Uganda, two villages have been completely transformed by the new CARITASfunded water wells. With daily access to clean water, children can finally go to school instead of walking miles to fetch water for their families.

Father Frank and his colleagues built a modest school to meet this growing need, but the classrooms urgently require renovation. Phase 1, Year 1 focuses on renovating four classroom buildings, a \$33,360 project. Thanks to a generous anonymous donor covering half the cost, we are already more than halfway towards our goal to fund this phase.

This project is not just improving a school, it is strengthening 2 entire villages, building up Catholic education, and creating a foundation for a sustainable future.



3. NIGERIA CHRISTMAS PARTY

Each year, our CARITAS children in Nigeria gather for a simple Christmas celebration: Mass, joyful music, dancing, and a shared meal. For many of these children, who come from extremely poor families, this may be the only Christmas

celebration they experience.

With just \$500, we can host the entire celebration: decorations, small gifts, food, and a festive gathering that reminds every child they are loved and part of CARITAS family. our country where thousands of Christians have been killed this year, moments of joy, unity, and faith are especially precious.




The State of Healthcare in Uganda

Uganda's health-care system is improving, but for millions of families, essential care remains out of reach.

While the country has made like progress in areas immunization and maternal health, many **Ugandans** still afford treatment cannot for even simple illnesses. As a result, preventable conditions often go untreated for months—or years.





Teddy's teeth being evaluated

In our latest blog post, we take you beyond the statistics to meet 17-year-old Teddy, whose story reflects the daily reality of countless children in Uganda. After years of untreated dental infections, Teddy faced severe pain and the loss of nearly all her teeth. Her younger brother Nicolas has also lived with untreated asthma for six years, simply because medical care is unaffordable for their family.

Thanks to the compassion of CARITAS For Children donors, Teddy is finally receiving the treatment she desperately needs—restoring not only her smile, but her confidence and future.



Family in the Spotlight



In rural Uganda lives a family of five children (**Teddy**, **Job**, **David**, **Nicolas**, **and Steven**) who have endured tremendous hardship since the tragic death of their father eight years ago. Their mother, a peasant farmer, has worked tirelessly to care for them despite poverty, illness, and the constant struggle to afford even their most basic needs.

TEDDY NAMUGAMBE

Teddy lost her sponsor last year and urgently needs support to continue school. After the death of her father, she lived briefly with an aunt, where poor nutrition led to severe tooth decay. Today, Teddy is in the process of receiving dental care thanks to generous donors through CARITAS. Now, all she needs is a new sponsor to support her education!

Despite everything, she dreams of working in the medical field to prevent others from suffering the way her father did when he lacked proper care.

To help Teddy attend day school, she will need:

NICOLAS SSENKUBUGE

Nicolas is intelligent and loves math and soccer, but his life is defined by chronic illness. He suffers from asthma and autoimmune complications that have gone untreated for six years because his mother cannot afford medication. He frequently misses school due to fevers and breathing problems. Support would allow him to receive medical care and stay in school consistently.



To help Nicolas attend day school, he will need:

• \$48 per month from one sponsor





STEVEN BYAKATONDA

Steven was born after the other children by a different father. Sadly, his father abandoned the family. Though his mother struggles to pay school fees, Steven excels in English, participates actively in class, and is well-loved by teachers. Consistent support would help him continue the strong educational start he has worked so hard for.

THE STRENGTH OF A FAMILY

With no job training and only small farming work available, the children's mother provides as best she can. Their home, built long ago by their late father, has recently been damaged by heavy rain, another reminder of the instability they face every day.





Through all loss, illness, and poverty, these children continue to dream. Teddy wants to become a doctor. Nicolas wants to learn without fear of the next asthma attack. Steven wants to stay in school and succeed.

With support (medical care, school fees, and stable sponsorship) this family can move from simply surviving to rebuilding their future with dignity and hope.
